

Plan ahead for a fire emergency...

If you have a physical disability, make sure your employer includes your special needs in evacuation plans.

Employers should

- Post building-evacuation plans.
- Conduct regular mandatory fire drills.
- Include disabled employees in emergency planning.



Fight arson:

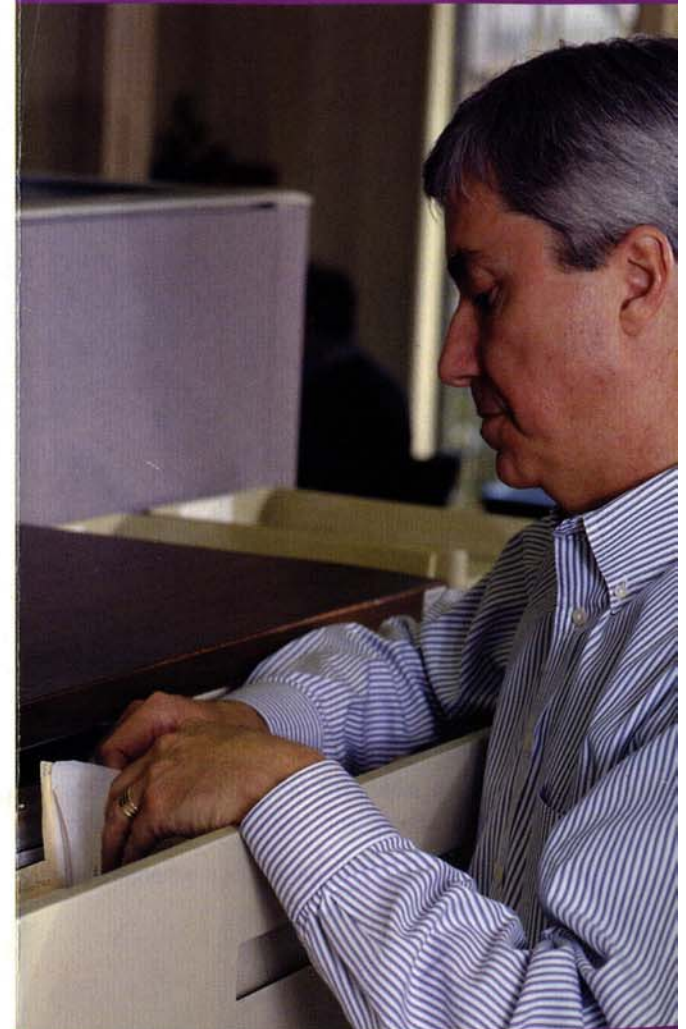
Protect your workplace. Lock doors after hours and keep public areas well lit and clear of brush and rubbish.

If a fire strikes...

- Leave immediately and close doors behind you.
- Sound the alarm — even for a small fire.
- If you see smoke, try another escape route.
- If you have to escape through smoke, crawl. Keep your head one to two feet (30 to 60 centimeters) above the floor. That's where the air will be cleanest.
- Test doorknobs and the space between the door and its frame with the back of your hand before opening doors. If the door is warm, try another escape route. If it's cool, open it slowly. Be ready to slam the door shut if smoke pours through.
